
Fabric Requirements

40 2 ½" WOF Strips (or one Jelly Roll)



Step 1 - Arranging Your Fabrics


 Arrange your strips in 2 sets of 20 fabrics ordered from darkest to lightest



- Make pairs, the two darkest, the two next darkest etc until the two lightest
- Number them in order from 1-20

Step 2 - Cutting Your Fabrics

Take set 1 and set 20 and make a stack of 4 strips




- Trim the selvage from the left
- Measure 2 ½" from the left

- Cut through all four layers
- Measure 40 ½" from the left

Cut through all four layers

• Take the marker 1 and place it on the small stack, Take the maker 20 and place it on the large stack



Repeat with the remaining stacks with the following measurements

1-20	2 ½"	40 ½"
2-19	4 ½"	38 ½"
3-18	6 ½"	36 ½"
4-17	8 ½"	34 ½"
5-16	10 ½"	32 ½"
6-15	12 ½"	30 ½"
7-14	14 ½"	28 ½"
8-13	16 ½"	26 ½"
9-12	18 ½"	24 ½"
10-11	20 ½	22 ½"

Step 3-Block Assembly


• Take stack number 1 and lay them out right side facing up. You should have two dark and two light


• Sew stack 2 to the right of stack 1







• Sew stack 3 on the left of the block






• Sew stack 4 on the right of the block






• Sew stack 5 on the left and 6 on the right




- Continue to sew stacks to the block, even numbered on the right and odd numbers on the left until all 20 stacks are sewn
- You should 2 blocks that go light to dark and 2 blocks that go dark to light



Step 4 - Layout and Quilt Assembly

 Lay one of the dark blocks down with the dark corner in the top right



- Place one of the light blocks on top aligning the right edge.
- Pin and sew
- Repeat with the second pair
- Lay one set on a flat surface and place the second pair on top, aligning the centre seam
- Pin blocks together starting at the centre and working out to the ends
- Sew seams
- The quilt top now measures 56 ½" x 56 ½" (finishes at 56" x 56")

Step 5 - Borders

You do not need to add borders unless you want to. I added a 2" border to the sides by cutting 3 WOF strips and sewing them together. And from this strip I cut two $56 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips. I then added a 6" border to the top and bottom by cutting 3 WOF strips and sewing them together. And from this strips I cut two $60 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips. This means my quilt will finish at 60" W x 68"H



Step 6 - Quilting

This design will suit straight line quilting on your domestic sewing machine. Just follow the path of the strip. Wavy lines will also work.

Work in block sections.

Variation #1

If your Jelly Roll is only 41" wide, here is a how you can make the same style quilt. You will need 36 strips. Your quilt will finish 51" by 51"

Strip Set	First Cut	Second Cut
1-18	2 ½"	36 ½"
2-17	4 ½"	34 ½"
3-16	6 ½"	32 ½"
4-15	8 ½"	30 ½"
5-14	10 ½"	28 ½"
6-13	12 ½"	26 ½"
7-12	14 ½"	24 ½"
8-11	16 ½"	22 ½"
9-10	18 ½"	20 ½"

Variation #2

If you want to make a smaller quilt, use 28 strips 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 31". Quilt will finish 39" x 39

1-14	2 ½"	28 ½"
2-13	4 ½"	26 ½"
3-12	6 ½"	24 ½"
4-11	8 ½"	22 ½"
5-10	10 ½"	20 ½"
6-9	12 ½"	18 ½"
7-8	14 ½"	16 ½"
